7 CHARTER RESOLUTION 11-CR-02  
8

9 Charter Resolution of the Town of University Park, Maryland, pursuant to the authority of  
10 Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland and Section 13 of Article 23A of the Annotated Code  
11 of Maryland, as amended, to amend the Charter of the Town of University Park, by repealing and  
12 re-enacting Article III, "Mayor and Common Council", Section 301, "Number, Term of Office",  
13 Section 304 "Meetings of Mayor and Council", and Article V "Registration, Nomination and  
14 Elections", Section 504 "Elections" of said Charter to remove terms limits for the offices of Mayor  
15 and Council, and to change the terms of office so that Mayor and Council are all elected in the  
16 same year with two year terms.

17 Section 1: Be it resolved and ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of University  
18 Park that Article III, "Mayor and Common Council", Section 301, "Number, Term of Office" of  
19 the Charter of the Town of University Park be repealed and re-enacted as follows:

20 Section 301. Number, Term of Office  
21

22 [(a)] The Common Council shall consist of seven members and a Mayor who shall  
23 be elected as set forth in Article V. The Mayor and Council members shall each hold office for a  
24 term of two years, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE SET OUT HEREIN. The term of elected officers  
25 shall begin at the close of the regular meeting in May and shall end at the close of the regular  
26 meeting in May of the final year of the term of office of such person, or until a successor takes  
27 office, whichever is later. THE TERM OF OFFICERS ELECTED IN MAY, 2012 ONLY SHALL  
28 BEGIN AT THE CLOSE OF THE REGULAR MEETING IN MAY, 2012 AND SHALL END  
29 AT THE CLOSE OF THE REGULAR MEETING IN MAY, 2013. THE TERM OF OFFICERS  
30 ELECTED IN MAY, 2013, SHALL BEGIN AT THE CLOSE OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
31 IN MAY AND SHALL END ON JUNE 30, 2015. ALL OFFICERS ELECTED AFTER MAY,

9 Section 2: Be it further resolved and ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of  
10 University Park that Article III, "Mayor and Common Council", Section 304, "Meetings" of the  
11 Charter of the Town of University Park be repealed and re-enacted as follows:

12 Section 304. Meetings of Mayor and Council  
13

14 (a) Regular Meetings. The Mayor and Common Council shall meet in a convenient  
15 place in the Town on or before the last Monday in [May] JUNE of each year, and as often  
16 thereafter as may be necessary to discharge their duties, provided, however, that they shall not  
17 meet less than once in every month. Special meetings may be called by the Mayor with the consent  
18 of a majority of the Council. The Mayor shall also call a special meeting at the request of a  
19 majority of the members of the Council. In the absence of the Mayor, a majority of the members of  
20 the Common Council, may call a special meeting for a specific purpose. No matters other than  
21 those for which the meeting is called may be considered. Upon convening such meeting the  
22 Council may elect a chairperson to preside at the special meeting. Except as otherwise provided in  
23 subsection (b) of this section, meetings of the Mayor and Common Council shall be open to the  
24 public and residents of the Town shall have reasonable opportunity to be heard at any meeting in  
25 regard to any municipal question.

29 Section 3: Be it further resolved and ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of  
30 University Park that Article V, "Registration, Nomination and Elections", Section 504,  
31 "Elections" of the Charter of the Town of University Park be repealed and re-enacted as follows:

32 Section 504. Elections

33 (a) At or before the February general meeting each ELECTION year, the Common  
34 Council will set the date in May for general elections in the Town. If the Common Council fails to  
35 do so on or before that date, the general elections for Town offices shall be held on the first  
36 Tuesday in May. The Mayor and Common Council are authorized to provide for the conduct of  
37 special elections, as appropriate. Special elections shall be conducted, as far as practicable, under

1 the same procedures as general elections.

6 Section 4: Be it further resolved that this resolution shall become effective fifty days after  
7 enactment by the Mayor and Common Council of University Park, Maryland, unless petitioned to  
8 referendum in a manner prescribed by law.

9 Section 5: Be it further resolved that a complete and exact copy of this proposed Charter  
10 amendment shall be posted on the entrance door of the Town Hall of University Park, 6724  
11 Baltimore Avenue, University Park, Maryland, for a period of not less than forty (40) days, and a  
12 fair summary of this Charter amendment shall be published at least four times on four successive  
13 weeks within that forty day period in a newspaper having general circulation in the community.
